## April 10-17 Campout at Bandits Roost

We had a **business meeting** on Friday, where **Bob Hollup** was elected Vice President, and **Carolyn Dangoor** was elected Secretary. Alice McLaurin took minutes of the meeting, and Daryl Sponseller reported that we have \$859.74 in the bank and \$94.07 in cash. Jimmy Crawford (who will officially join in May) volunteered to host the May campout because he lives in the area, and Bobbi Harden volunteered to co-host.

We had ten members and three guests at the campout, but not all at the same time. Most arrived on Tuesday and left the following Sunday to attend the Escapee Pre-Rally and Rally in Marion. Two members and two guests stayed until Tuesday. Members were Alice McLaurin, Bobbi Harden, Bob Hollup, Carolyn Dangoor, Cheryl Love, David Poole, Daryl Sponseller, John Henry Markham, Linda Kendall, and Norma Owen. The first few days were cool and windy and the last few were warm and sunny—no rain. The campground and lake are very nice but made you want a boat when the weather warmed. We went to the Wilkes Heritage Museum, where we learned that NASCAR has its roots in Wilkes County moonshine runners like Junior Johnson, and that Lowe's started as a local hardware store in North Wilkesboro. We went to the Whippoorwill Academy and Village, where Edith Carter has a replica of Daniel Boone's Wilkes County cabin, a Tom Dooley (Dula) museum, and several other restored old buildings. We enjoyed her tour, her storytelling, and being put in her jail for our various "crimes." We went to St. Paul's Episcopal Church and saw two Benjamin Long frescoes and went to the original Mast General Store in Valle Crucis. We had a lunch out, a dinner out, and a pot luck, and did our usual exploring of shops in Wilkesboro, North Wilkesboro, and Boone. The four members left on Sunday went to Moravian Falls, had a picnic lunch at Wilkes Community College Gardens, which was being set up for MerleFest; and two of us plus a guest had a campfire that night. Monday, the three members left enjoyed the conversations, the weather, the campground (I biked), the lake (Jimmy put in his inflatable boat), and a second dinner out that night.
