 The rally theme is Woodstock Revisited. Registration is \$55.00 and includes 3 dinners, 1 potluck, and 4 breakfasts. Late registration (after October 12) is \$60. **Make your check payable to Southeast Citrus Rally and send to Bobbi Harden, 65 Sunrise Court, Dawsonville, GA 30534; 678-617-5748 or 706-348-8443.**
 Camping is \$35/night and includes full hookup. **Call Sun-N-Fun Resort to make your reservation.** Let them know you are with the LOWS SE Citrus Rally. **The \$35 rate is good for up to seven additional nights before or after the rally.** You will be required to pay in full in advance but Sun-N-Fun will refund your full payment if reservation is cancelled at least 24 hrs before arrival. A number of campsites are on hold for the rally, but after Oct 15, unreserved sites will be released. Co-hosts are Judy Turner 941-346-0592 and Noreen Whalen 301-991-6072.

SeLoWs will not have a campout before the Citrus rally. After the Citrus Rally, some members plan to attend an Escapee rally sponsored by Chapter 57, the Florida Sun Gators, November 14-18 at Harbor Lakes RV Park, Port Charlotte, FL. Details will be in the Summer and Fall issues of their newsletter, Gator Tales. Because there are four days between the two rallies, we will stay two days after the rally at Sun-N-Fun and two days before the rally at Harbor Lakes.
